



Third-Party Equipment Policy

Happier in Wellies Marquee Hire

1. Purpose

This policy outlines the terms and responsibilities regarding third-party equipment, services, and suppliers used in conjunction with **Happier in Wellies** marquee hire services.

2. Scope

This policy applies to:

- All clients hiring marquees and accessories from the Company.
- Any third-party suppliers, subcontractors, or services involved in the event, including but not limited to furniture, lighting, heating, generators, décor, and catering equipment.

3. Legal Framework

This policy is designed to comply with:

- The Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974
- The Supply of Goods and Services Act 1982
- UK industry standards for temporary demountable structures and equipment use

4. Company Responsibilities

Happier in Wellies will:

1. Provide guidance and advice on compatibility of third-party equipment with the marquee structure.
2. Inform clients of any risks associated with third-party equipment installation.
3. Maintain responsibility for its own equipment only.

5. Client Responsibilities

Clients must:



1. Ensure all third-party equipment is safe, compliant with regulations, and suitable for use with the marquee.
2. Obtain any required permissions for third-party installation.
3. Coordinate timing and access for third-party suppliers.
4. Ensure third-party suppliers adhere to site rules and safety guidance.

6. Liability

- The Company is not liable for damage, malfunction, or injury caused by third-party equipment or services.
- The Hirer assumes full responsibility for the use, installation, and operation of third-party equipment.
- Any damages caused by third-party equipment to the marquee or Company property may result in charges to the Hirer.

7. Acceptance

By hiring a marquee, the client acknowledges understanding and agreement to the terms of this Third-Party Equipment Policy.

8. Governing Law

This policy is governed by the laws of **England and Wales**.
